

## COVID-19 Specific - Play Area/Outside Gym Risk Assessment

COVID-19 is a new illness that can affect your lungs and airways and is caused by a virus called Coronavirus. The symptoms can be mild, moderate, severe, or fatal.

This Risk Assessment concludes that users the facilities and their responsible adults of must be responsible for the safe use of the facilities and should sanitise any equipment before and after use as a minimum.

Victory Park is an un-supervised public open space with a variety of facilities available for early years up to adults. The Outdoor Gym, children's playground and swings are all potential areas of cross-contamination by physical touch / contact. The MUGA is deemed to present minimal risk due to its location and use but social distancing should be maintained.

Social distancing, face coverings, sanitising and responsible behaviour within the published Government and locally displayed guidelines are a necessary requirement of the users of the facilities, with a particular emphasis on the responsibility of adults and carers to be responsible for the supervised use of the equipment and maintenance of social distancing by early years and under 14's.
